

## 2024 Regular Session

The Legislature convened for the twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth, and thirtieth legislative days of the Regular Session this week and has adjourned sine die.

The Legislature passed both budgets and related bills, which have been sent to the Governor for her signature.

SB32, by Sen. Barfoot, received final passage by the Legislature and has been sent to the Governor for her signature. SB32 removes the requirement that retirement benefit garnishments for restitution must run through the District Attorneys' Restitution Recovery Division.
