

Week 10 Update

The Legislature convened for the twenty-third and twenty-fourth legislative days of the Regular Session this week.

The Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund gave a favorable report to HB312, by Rep. Hill, which increases the benefit multiplier for district attorneys from 3% to 4%.

The House Ways and Means General Fund committee gave favorable reports to two RSA bills.

- SB280, by Sen. Waggoner, would allow members to purchase up to 4 years of federal nonmilitary time under the same circumstances that out-of-state service can be purchased.
- HB589, by Rep. Simpson, would allow judges, clerks, and district attorneys to purchase withdrawn service, similar to provisions allowing ERS and TRS members to do the same.

SB58, by Sen. Orr, which requires a public employee found guilty of certain offenses to use retirement contributions for restitution, passed the House. The bill has been sent to the Governor for her signature.

No new bills dealing with RSA were introduced this week.
