1 Enrolled, An Act,

2 To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the
3 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State,
4 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for
5 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated
8 from the named funds for the 2025 fiscal year to the state
9 agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
10 expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all
11 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
12 the Alabama Statutes.

13 For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for
14 expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals
15 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
16 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in
17 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the
18 following definitions shall be applicable.

19 "Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of
20 all funding sources.

21 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services
22 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be
23 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or
24 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended
25 only for such purposes.

26 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result
27 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or



28 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of
29 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only
30 for such purposes.

31 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
32 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
33 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

34 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,
35 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the
36 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

37 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts
38 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,
39 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other
40 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital
41 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, to be
42 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other
43 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as
44 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the
45 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not
46 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the
47 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through
48 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that
49 regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been
50 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of
51 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be
52 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay
53 date falls.

54 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at

There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all revenue generated from bailment fees shall remain with the Board to be used for its operations.

3497 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions
3498 authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama
3499 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal
3500 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the
3501 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the
3502 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the
3503 appropriation or appropriations were made.

3504 Section 18. The appropriations made herein to the
3505 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies
3506 include the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards,

3507 offices, commissions, and agencies are hereby directed to make
3508 the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in
3509 said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated
3510 in this act and receiving services from other governmental
3511 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a
3512 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for
3513 such services.

3514 Section 19. All funds collected under Section
3515 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date
3516 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2024, are hereby appropriated
3517 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for
3518 the administration of the examiner certification program
3519 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards
3520 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of
3521 Alabama 1975.

3522 Section 20. It is the intent of the Legislature that
3523 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President
3524 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 3 of this act which are
3525 not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate
3526 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized
3527 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code
3528 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of
3529 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama
3530 1975.

3531 Section 21. The appropriations made herein to the
3532 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies
3533 include the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate



3534 shall be \$1,005 per month for each full-time employee for the
3535 fiscal year ending September 30, 2025. In addition to the
3536 amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby
3537 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same
3538 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and
3539 employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase
3540 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts
3541 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall
3542 not exceed \$3,500,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30,
3543 2025. The Director of Finance shall ensure first priority
3544 shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including

3557 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the
3558 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of
3559 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds
3560 appropriated in this act.

3561 Section 23. All nongovernmental entities, identified
3562 by the Legislative Services Agency, which are allocated funds
3563 in Section 3 of this act shall file a report with the Chairs
3564 of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Senate
3565 Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance
3566 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the
3567 start of the 2025 Regular Session, regarding the proposed
3568 expenditures and usage of the funds appropriated in the fiscal
3569 year ending September 30, 2025. The Legislative Services
3570 Agency shall provide notice to the identified nongovernmental
3571 entities within 60 days following enactment of this act
3572 regarding the reporting requirements and the methodology to
3573 submit reports and format to be used, which may include an
3574 online platform.

3575 Section 24. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
3576 clause, provision, or portion of this act or all or any
3577 portion of any appropriations herein made be held
3578 unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other
3579 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or portion of
3580 this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or
3581 portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself
3582 unconstitutional or invalid.

3583 Section 25. All laws or parts of laws, general,
3584 special, private, or local that are in conflict with or
3585 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby
3586 expressly repealed.

3587 Section 26. Each agency of the state funded through
