1 Enrolled, An Act,

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3 To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the
4 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State,
5 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for
6 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated
9 from the named funds for the 2026 fiscal year to the state
10 agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
11 expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all
12 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
13 the Alabama Statutes.

14 For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for
15 expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals
16 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
17 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in
18 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the
19 following definitions shall be applicable.

20 "Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of
21 all funding sources.

22 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services
23 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be
24 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or
25 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended
26 only for such purposes.

27 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result



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28 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or
29 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of
30 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only
31 for such purposes.

32 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
33 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
34 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

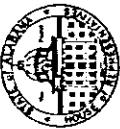
35 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,
36 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the
37 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

38 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts
39 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,
40 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other
41 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital
42 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to be
43 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other
44 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as
45 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the
46 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not
47 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the
48 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through
49 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that
50 regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been
51 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of
52 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be
53 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay
54 date falls.



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55 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at
56 the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a
57 program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.

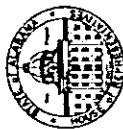

In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for each additional retail and wholesale store that is relocated or put into operation during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all revenue generated from bailment fees shall remain with the Board to be used for its operations.

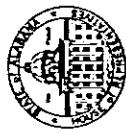

3506 Section 4. The State General Fund appropriations in
3507 this act anticipate a beginning balance in the State General
3508 Fund for fiscal year 2026, excluding reversions and
3509 adjustments, of \$333,607,538. If the State General Fund
3510 beginning balance for Fiscal Year 2026, excluding reversions
3511 and adjustments, is greater than the above stated anticipated
3512 amount, then the first \$37,500,000 of the unanticipated and
3513 unappropriated beginning balance is hereby appropriated from
3514 the State General Fund to Legislative Council for expenses
3515 related to the new State House. The remaining amount of the
3516 unanticipated and unappropriated beginning balance, not to
3517 exceed a total of \$4,000,000, shall be appropriated from the
3518 State General Fund to the following entities: (1) State
3519 Industrial Development Authority to provide grants for the
3520 assessment of and subsequent development of sites, \$3,000,000;
3521 and (2) State Law Enforcement Agency for Capitol Security,
3522 \$1,000,000.

3523 Section 5. Notwithstanding any other provisions of

3570 Section 10. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation
3571 herein made from the State General Fund to any office,

3573 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other
3574 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when
3575 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board,
3576 commission, or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that
3577 office, department, bureau, board, commission, or agency.

3578 Section 11. (a) In addition to appropriations herein
3579 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions, or
3580 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act,
3581 including grants by the Congress of the United States,
3582 municipalities, or counties, to any department, division,
3583 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office, or
3584 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and,
3585 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to



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3586 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency,
3587 institution, office, or officer to be used only for the
3588 purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or

3604 from any appropriations made for fiscal year 2025 that remain

3607 (c) This section shall also not apply to any additional
3608 federal stimulus funds provided to the state in fiscal year
3609 2026 for purposes directly related to the coronavirus

3611 federal programs.

3612 Section 12. The Department of Examiners of Public



3613 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary
3614 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of
3615 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in
3616 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5A, Code
3617 of Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all
3618 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts
3619 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery
3620 audits as provided for in Section 41-5A-6, Code of Alabama
3621 1975.

3622 Section 13. Upon certification to the Director of
3623 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has
3624 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or
3625 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby
3626 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or
3627 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such
3628 department, board, bureau, or commission in the amount
3629 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are
3630 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter
3631 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are
3632 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination
3633 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are
3634 not available for the court-ordered payments.

3635 Section 14. All interest earned from funds paid into
3636 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act
3637 90-556, and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the
3638 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of
3639 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from



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3640 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal
3641 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd
3642 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
3643 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

3644 Section 15. All encumbered balances of a previous
3645 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions
3646 authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama
3647 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal
3648 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the
3649 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the
3650 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the
3651 appropriation or appropriations were made.

3652 Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the
3653 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies
3654 include the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards,
3655 offices, commissions, and agencies are hereby directed to make
3656 the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in
3657 said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated
3658 in this act and receiving services from other governmental
3659 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a

3661 Section 17. All funds collected under Section
3662 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date
3663 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2025, are hereby appropriated
3664 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for
3665 the administration of the examiner certification program
3666 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards



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3667 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of
3668 Alabama 1975.

3669 Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that
3670 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President
3671 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 3 of this act which are
3672 not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate
3673 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized
3674 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code
3675 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of
3676 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama
3677 1975.

3678 Section 19. The appropriations made herein to the
3679 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies
3680 include the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate
3681 shall be \$1,025 per month for each full-time employee for the
3682 fiscal year ending September 30, 2026. In addition to the
3683 amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby
3684 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same
3685 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and
3686 employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase
3687 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts
3688 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall
3689 not exceed \$2,500,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30,
3690 2026. The Director of Finance shall ensure first priority
3691 shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including
3692 the payroll of the legislature. State agencies may receive

3708 Section 21. All nongovernmental entities, identified
3709 by the Legislative Services Agency, which are allocated funds
3710 in Section 3 of this act shall file a report with the Chairs
3711 of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Senate
3712 Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance
3713 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the
3714 start of the 2026 Regular Session, regarding the proposed
3715 expenditures and usage of the funds appropriated in the fiscal
3716 year ending September 30, 2026. The Legislative Services
3717 Agency shall provide notice to the identified nongovernmental
3718 entities within 60 days following enactment of this act
3719 regarding the reporting requirements and the methodology to
3720 submit reports and format to be used, which may include an



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3721 online platform.

3722 Section 22. Any state agency providing direct
3723 assistance or support to local governments from state funds
3724 appropriated in this act shall file a report with the Chairs
3725 of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Senate
3726 Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance
3727 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the
3728 start of the 2026 Regular Session, regarding the cost of the
3729 assistance provided with state funds and the amount of local
3730 contribution. The agencies shall also provide copies of any
3731 MOUs between the state agency and the local government.

3732 Section 23. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
3733 clause, provision, or portion of this act or all or any
3734 portion of any appropriations herein made be held
3735 unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other
3736 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or portion of
3737 this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or
3738 portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself
3739 unconstitutional or invalid.

3740 Section 24. All laws or parts of laws, general,
3741 special, private, or local that are in conflict with or
3742 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby
3743 expressly repealed.

3744 Section 25. Each agency of the state funded through
3745 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity
3746 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of
3747 this state without regard to sex or race.



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3748 Section 26. This act shall become effective October 1,
3749 2025.
