1 Enrolled, An Act,

2 To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the  
3 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State,  
4 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for  
5 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated  
8 from the named funds for the 2027 fiscal year to the state  
9 agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the  
10 expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all  
11 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of  
12 the Alabama Statutes.

13 For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for  
14 expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals  
15 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is  
16 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in  
17 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the  
18 following definitions shall be applicable.

19 "Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of  
20 all funding sources.

21 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services  
22 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be  
23 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or  
24 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended  
25 only for such purposes.

26 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result  
27 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or



28 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of  
29 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only  
30 for such purposes.

31 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the  
32 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations  
33 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

34 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,  
35 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the  
36 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

37 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts  
38 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,  
39 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other  
40 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital  
41 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027, to be  
42 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other  
43 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as  
44 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the  
45 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not  
46 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the  
47 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through  
48 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that  
49 regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been  
50 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of  
51 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be  
52 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay  
53 date falls.

54 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at



55 the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a  
56 program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.

<p>In accordance with Sections 12-19-310 through 12-19-315, Code of Alabama 1975. During fiscal year 2027, and notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Alabama may transfer up to \$12,000,000 from local discretionary funds managed by circuit clerks and circuit and district judges, including Circuit Clerk's Funds, Circuit Clerk's Judicial Administration Funds, and Presiding Judge Judicial Administration Funds. The Chief Justice may require each circuit clerk or judge responsible for the administration of such funds to remit to the Administrative Office of Courts a graduated proportional share of the available balances of such funds. The Chief Justice may establish the schedule, methodology, and date used to determine the balances subject to transfer, and any amounts expended after that date that would otherwise reduce the balances subject to transfer may be included in calculating the required remittance. Any funds transferred pursuant to this section shall be remitted to the Administrative Director of Courts for deposit into the State Judicial Administration Fund and used for the operational expenses of the Unified Judicial System in fiscal year 2027.</p>

In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for each additional retail and wholesale store that is relocated or put into operation during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality, there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all revenue generated from bailment fees shall remain with the Board to be used for its operations.

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Section 4. In addition to the amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and employees are paid, such additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a two percent (2%) salary increase enacted in the 2026 Regular Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$16,000,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027. The Director of Finance shall ensure that first priority shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including the payroll of the Legislature. State agencies shall receive additional allocations from the appropriation made in this section from the State General Fund in amounts necessary to increase total salaries paid from the State General Fund by two percent. The remainder of this appropriation from the State General Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the State General Fund.

Section 5. (a) The State General Fund appropriations in this act anticipate a beginning balance in the State General Fund for fiscal year 2027, excluding reversions and adjustments, of \$300,120,715. If the State General Fund beginning balance for Fiscal Year 2027, excluding reversions and adjustments, is greater than the above stated anticipated amount, then the first \$2,400,000 of the unanticipated and

3764 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 3 of this act which are  
3765 not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate  
3766 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized  
3767 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code  
3768 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of  
3769 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama  
3770 1975.

3771 Section 21. The appropriations made herein to the  
3772 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies  
3773 include the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate  
3774 shall be \$1,175 per month for each full-time employee for the  
3775 fiscal year ending September 30, 2027. In addition to the  
3776 amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby  
3777 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same  
3778 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and  
3779 employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase  
3780 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts  
3781 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall  
3782 not exceed \$18,000,000 for the fiscal year ending September  
3783 30, 2027. The Director of Finance shall ensure first priority  
3784 shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including  
3785 the payroll of the legislature. State agencies may receive



3786 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this  
3787 section from the State General Fund in amounts necessary to  
3788 pay for the increase. The remainder of this appropriation from  
3789 the State General Fund may be allocated by the Director of  
3790 Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the  
3791 State General Fund. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance  
3792 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned  
3793 fixed rate.

3794           Section 22. It is the intent of the Legislature that  
3795 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House  
3796 Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate  
3797 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the  
3798 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of  
3799 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds  
3800 appropriated in this act.

3801           Section 23. All nongovernmental entities, identified  
3802 by the Legislative Services Agency, which are allocated funds  
3803 in Section 3 of this act shall file a report with the Chair of  
3804 the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, Chair of the  
3805 Senate Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance  
3806 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the  
3807 start of the 2027 Regular Session, regarding the proposed  
3808 expenditures and usage of the funds appropriated in the fiscal  
3809 year ending September 30, 2027. The Legislative Services  
3810 Agency shall provide notice to the identified nongovernmental  
3811 entities within 60 days following enactment of this act  
3812 regarding the reporting requirements and the methodology to



3813 submit reports and format to be used, which may include an  
3814 online platform.

3815 Section 24. (a) Any state agency providing direct  
3816 assistance or support to local governments from state funds  
3817 appropriated in this act shall file a report with the Chair of  
3818 the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Chair of  
3819 the Senate Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund,  
3820 Finance Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to  
3821 the start of the 2027 Regular Session, regarding the cost of  
3822 the assistance provided with state funds and the amount of  
3823 local contribution. The agencies shall also provide copies of  
3824 any MOUs between the state agency and the local government.

3825 (b) The Department of Finance shall provide notice to  
3826 all state agencies of the requirements of this section.

3827 Section 25. If any section, paragraph, sentence,  
3828 clause, provision, or portion of this act or all or any  
3829 portion of any appropriations herein made be held  
3830 unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other  
3831 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or portion of  
3832 this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or  
3833 portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself  
3834 unconstitutional or invalid.

3835 Section 26. All laws or parts of laws, general,  
3836 special, private, or local that are in conflict with or  
3837 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby  
3838 expressly repealed.

3839 Section 27. Each agency of the state funded through



3840 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity  
3841 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of  
3842 this state without regard to sex or race.

3843 Section 28. This act shall become effective October 1,  
3844 2026.
