

ALL Kids Children's Health Insurance Program

(Active Members)

In 2010, federal law changed allowing eligible dependents of public education employees to participate in the ALL Kids Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) administered by the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH).

Children may be eligible if they are:

- An Alabama resident,
- Under age 19,
- A U.S. Citizen or an eligible immigrant,
- Not covered or eligible for Medicaid,
- Not a resident in an institution,
- Not covered by other group health insurance, and
- Within the income ranges established for participation (see income guidelines).

How to apply:

- Complete an application online at www.alabamapublichealth.gov or download a paper application from the ADPH website. You can also call 888.373.KIDS (5437) to have an application mailed to you.
- ALL Kids will determine eligibility for your children and will let you know if your child is:
 - eligible and is being enrolled in ALL Kids, or
 - in the Alabama Medicaid Program, or
 - over income and not otherwise eligible.

Members must re-apply for ALL Kids each year to continue to receive coverage.

Becoming eligible for ALL Kids is not a Qualifying Life Event to drop children from PEEHIP coverage outside of Open Enrollment. If you wish to enroll your eligible children in ALL Kids, you will need to cancel their PEEHIP coverage during Open Enrollment and apply for ALL Kids for an October 1 effective date.
