12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations
14	heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a
15	total of \$1,283,283,616 from the Education Trust Fund to the
16	following agencies and entities for the purposes specified
17	below:
18	(1) \$177,373,600 to the State Treasurer's Office for
19	the PACT Program to fully and finally satisfy the entirety of
20	the state's present and future obligation pursuant to Section
21	16-33C-16, Code of Alabama 1975.
22	(2) \$58,400,000 to the Teachers' Retirement System
23	for a one-time longevity bonus for retirees of the Teachers'
24	Retirement System. This appropriation is conditioned upon the
25	enactment of SB30 or HB137 during the 2022 Regular Session
26	authorizing such bonus.

1 (3) \$652,128,556 to the Education Trust Fund 2 Advancement and Technology Fund to be allocated in accordance 3 with Section 29-9-4, Code of Alabama 1975.

- (4) \$1,250,000 to the Department of Commerce to be used for Alex: The Alabama Experience at the World Games and thereafter to support workforce efforts throughout the state.
- (5) \$5,250,000 to the Marine Environmental Sciences Consortium. Of this appropriation, \$4,000,000 shall be expended for renovations on student dormitories; \$500,000 shall be expended for modernization of the HVAC and food storage systems and serving line in the cafeteria; and \$750,000 shall be expended for replacement of a graduate student office/K-12 computer laboratory building.
- (6) \$7,000,000 to the Geological Survey to construct a new Core and Sample Repository Building.
 - (7) \$1,000,000 to the Alabama Department of Veterans' Affairs to be used to renovate the Alabama Veteran's Museum in Athens.
 - (8) \$1,500,000 to the Alabama Fire Fighters
 Personnel Standards and Education Commission/Alabama Fire
 College to be used for a new building that will house the
 mobile fleet of tractor-drawn training props.
 - (9) \$200,000,000 to the Education Trust Fund Debt Service Sinking Fund to be used for the existing debt service on the following bonds: GO 2014-A, GO 2016-C, GO 2018-A, GO 2018-B, AIFA 2009-B, AIFA 2019-A, and AIFA 2019-B.

(10) \$45,000,000 to the Alabama Innovation Fund. Of the above appropriation, \$15,000,000 shall be expended for Hudson Alpha Institute for Biotechnology; and \$30,000,000

shall be expended for the Southern Research Institute.

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- (11) \$111,181,460 to the Education Trust Fund Budget Stabilization Fund established by Section 29-9-4, Code of Alabama 1975.
- (12) \$6,980,000 to the Alabama Community College System. Of this appropriation, \$3,750,000 shall be expended for the Southern Union Community College Aviation project; \$3,000,000 shall be expended for the Wallace State Community College-Oneonta Blount County multi-purpose complex; and \$230,000 shall be expended for the Wallace State Community College-Hanceville Winston County Learning Center project.
- 15 (13) \$3,000,000 to the University of South Alabama 16 for the engineering building.
 - (14) \$2,000,000 to Tuskegee University for capital projects.
 - (15) \$1,000,000 to Alabama State University for improvements to the music and fine arts facilities.
 - (16) \$3,000,000 to the University of Alabama in Huntsville for the engineering building.
- 23 (17) \$2,000,000 to the University of Montevallo for electric repairs.
- 25 (18) \$3,000,000 to the Alabama Space Science Exhibit 26 Commission for the Shuttle Pathfinder restoration.

- 1 (19) \$500,000 to the Alabama Institute for the Deaf and Blind.
- 3 (20) \$700,000 to the Department of Public Health for 4 a new mobile facility for hearing screening for the Lions 5 Club.
 - (21) \$270,000 to the Alabama Commission on Higher Education for the Best and Brightest STEM Pilot Program under the same terms and conditions as Act 2020-204.

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- 9 (22) \$600,000 to the Department of Education. Of 10 this appropriation, \$500,000 shall be expended for Ed Farm, 11 and \$100,000 shall be expended for Kindervision.
 - (23) \$100,000 to the Alabama Music Hall of Fame.
- 13 (24) \$50,000 to the State Commission on Physical 14 Fitness for the Alabama Sports Council.

Section 2. All funds appropriated in this act not
expended in the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, shall
not revert, but shall be carried forward for the purpose
appropriated.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
