19	To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of
20	the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the
21	State, for other functions of government, for debt service,
22	and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September
23	30, 2020.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
26	from the named funds for the 2020 fiscal year to the state
27	agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the

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expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

10 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total11 of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

17 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 18 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 19 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 20 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 21 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

25 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
26 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
27 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

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Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the amounts 1 2 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other 3 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital 4 5 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to be 6 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other 7 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the 8 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not 9 10 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 11 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that re-12 13 gardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been 14 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of 15 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay 16 17 date falls.

21 Section 3. In addition to the amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from 22 23 the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 24 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 25 several State officials and employees are paid, such 26 additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a two 27 percent (2.0%) salary increase enacted in the 2019 Regular 28 Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section 29 from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$12,000,000 for

1 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020. The Director of 2 Finance shall ensure that first priority shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including the payroll of the 3 Legislature. State agencies shall receive additional 4 5 allocations from the appropriation made in this section from 6 the State General Fund in amounts necessary to increase total 7 salaries paid from the State General Fund by two percent. The remainder of this appropriation from the State General Fund 8 may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies 9 which receive transfers from the State General Fund. 10

11 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 12 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 13 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to the various 14 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 15 on September 30, 2019, are hereby reappropriated to the 16 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 17 2019.

Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 6. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020. The 1 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the 2 recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the 3 House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate 4 5 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval 6 of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through 7 41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-8, Code of 8 Alabama 1975. 9

10 Section 7. Except as may be herein otherwise 11 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 12 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 13 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 14 15 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 16 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated herein except as may be further provided for under this act, 17 as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 18 19 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those 20 appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the 21 Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 22 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, 23 conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80, et 24 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975. 25

26 Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any 27 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any

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office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein 7 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 8 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 9 10 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 11 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 12 13 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 14 15 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 16 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall 17 be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 18 19 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 20 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 21 22 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 23 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 24 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the 25 26 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

1 Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 2 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 3 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in 4 5 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 6 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts 7 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 8 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 9 10 1975.

11 Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of 12 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 13 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 14 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 15 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 16 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 17 18 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 19 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 20 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 21 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 22 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 23 not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from
 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal
 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd
 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

6 Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 7 authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 8 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 9 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 10 11 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 12 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 13 appropriation or appropriations were made.

14 Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the 15 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 16 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 17 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said 18 19 amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 20 this act and receiving services from other governmental 21 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 22 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 23 such services.

Section 15. All funds collected under Section 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2019 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for the administration of the examiner certification program
 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards
 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of
 Alabama 1975.

5 Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 6 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 2A of this act which 7 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 8 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 9 10 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 11 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 12 1975. 13

14 Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the 15 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 16 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year 17 ending September 30, 2020. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance 18 19 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned 20 fixed rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that 21 the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and 22 retired members.

23 Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that 24 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 25 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 26 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the Deputy 27 Director of the Legislative Services Agency-Fiscal Division of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting,
 of any of the funds appropriated in this act.

Section 19. (a) The Legislature declares that all 3 Education Trust Fund and General Fund acts and other 4 5 legislative documents are prepared using a database and 6 software system that is over twenty years old, containing over 201,000 documents. The database and software system have 7 become antiquated and can no longer support the functions of 8 the Legislature, even with ongoing maintenance and repair. For 9 these reasons, the Legislature finds it necessary to replace 10 11 and modernize the current appropriation bill drafting and 12 support system.

13 (b) The General Fund appropriations in this act anticipate a beginning balance in the General Fund for fiscal 14 year 2020, excluding reversions and adjustments, of 15 16 \$169,544,682. In addition to all other appropriations made in this act and notwithstanding any other law, if the beginning 17 balance in the General Fund, excluding reversions and 18 19 adjustments, is greater than \$169,544,682, the additional 20 beginning balance above \$169,544,682, not to exceed 21 \$4,000,000, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to 22 the Legislative Services Agency for a pilot project to replace 23 and modernize the appropriation bill drafting and support 24 system for fiscal year 2020.

25 Section 20. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 26 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 27 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph,
 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any
 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof
 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

5 Section 21. All laws or parts of laws, general, 6 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 7 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 8 expressly repealed.

9 Section 22. Each agency of the state funded through 10 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 11 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 12 this state without regard to sex or race.

13 Section 23. This act shall become effective October14 1, 2019.
