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4 SYNOPSIS:

> Under existing law, certain pension, annuity, or retirement allowance benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System and the Employees' Retirement System are subject to state or municipal tax, levy, sale, garnishment, attachment, or any other related process under certain circumstances.

This bill would revise the circumstances in which an individual's pension, annuity, or retirement allowance benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System and the Employees' Retirement System are subject to certain recovery actions.

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19 TO BE ENTITLED

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Relating to retirement benefits; to amend Sections 16-25-23 and 36-27-28, Code of Alabama 1975, to revise the circumstances in which an individual's pension, annuity, or retirement allowance benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System and the Employees' Retirement System are subject to certain recovery actions.

28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

29	Section 1. Sections 16-25-23 and 36-27-28, Code of
30	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

32	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the right of
33	a personan individual to a pension; an annuity, or a
34	retirement allowance; to the return of contributions; the
35	pension, annuity, or retirement allowance itself; any optional
36	benefit or any other right accrued or accruing to any
37	<pre>person_individual under the provisions of this chapter; and the</pre>
38	monies in the various funds created by this chapter are hereby
39	exempt from any state or municipal tax and exempt from levy
40	and sale, garnishment, attachment, or any other process
41	whatsoever, and shall be unassignable except as in this
42	<pre>chapter specifically otherwise provided in this chapter.</pre>
43	(b)(1) Restitution, fines, court costs, fees, or any
44	other financial obligations in a criminal case ordered by a
45	circuit or district court judge in this state are not subject
46	to the exemption set out in subsection (a), provided all both
47	of the following are satisfied:
48	a. The amount of the restitution ordered is in the
49	amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or greater.
50	b. The <pre>person</pre> individual subject to the order is a
51	retiree or beneficiary who is currently receiving benefits
52	from the Teachers' Retirement System.
53	c. The case has been assigned to the district
54	attorney's restitution recovery division.
55	(2) If the requirements of subdivision (1) are met, and
56	upon a motion filed by the district attorney, the circuit or

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- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the right of 90 91 a personan individual to a pension, an annuity, a retirement 92 allowance or to the return of contributions, the pension, 93 annuity, or retirement allowance itself and any optional benefit or any other right accrued or accruing to any 94 95 personindividual under the provisions of this article and the monies in the various funds created by this chapter are hereby 96 97 exempt from any state or municipal tax and exempt from levy 98 and sale, garnishment, attachment, or any other process 99 whatsoever and shall be unassignable except as in this article 100 specifically otherwise provided.
  - (b) (1) Restitution, fines, court costs, fees, or any other financial obligations in a criminal case ordered by a circuit or district court judge in this state are not subject to the exemption set out in subsection (a), provided allboth of the following are satisfied:
  - a. The amount of the restitution ordered is in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or greater.

122 (3) An order under subdivision (2) shall set out all of the following:

financial obligations ordered in the criminal case.

- a. The individual's name, date of birth, and Social
  Security number.
- b. The amount of restitution ordered is in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or greater.

- (4) The district attorney <a href="must\_shall">must\_shall</a> notify the court
  whenever the restitution, fines, court costs, fees, or other
  financial obligations are paid in full. Thereafter, the court



shall issue an order to stop the diversion of the individual's 141 142 funds. Any payment received by the circuit clerk in an amount 143 over what was owed shall be paid back to the Employees' 144 Retirement System within 60 days with the specific identifying 145 information as to the retiree or the beneficiary to whom it is owed." 146 147 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October 148 1, 2024.
