5	This bill would remove certain conditions under
6	which an elected official who has retired from the
7	Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees'
8	Retirement System may serve for his or her full
9	compensation in another elected public office without
10	suspension of retirement benefits.

14	TO BE ENTITLED
15	AN ACT
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17	Relating to the Retirement Systems of Alabama; to amend
18	Section 16-25-26 and Section 36-27-8.2, as amended by Act
19	2023-334 and Act 2023-564, Code of Alabama 1975, to remove
20	certain conditions under which an elected official who has
21	retired from the Teachers' Retirement System and the
22	Employees' Retirement System may serve for his or her full
23	compensation in another elected public office without
24	suspension of retirement benefits.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 16-25-26 and Section 36-27-8.2, as
27	amended by Act 2023-334 and Act 2023-564, of the Code of
28	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:



29 "\$16-25-26

30 (a) Any person who is retired under the Teachers' 31 Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity, 32 including as an independent contractor, with any employer 33 participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the 34 Teachers' Retirement System without suspension of his or her retirement allowance provided that (1) the person is not 35 36 employed in a permanent full-time capacity and (2) the 37 person's compensation from the employer in calendar year 2016 does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). Beginning 38 39 in calendar year 2017, and each calendar year thereafter, the annual earning limit shall be increased by the same percentage 40 increase as the increase in the Consumer Price Index for all 41 42 urban consumers as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, 43 Bureau of Labor Statistics. Any increase in the annual earning 44 limit shall be rounded to the next lowest multiple of one 45 thousand dollars (\$1,000) with any amount in excess of the one 46 thousand dollar (\$1,000) multiple considered in determining the increase for the following year. Each adjustment shall be 47 48 based on the increase in the index for the preceding 12-month 49 period ending on September 30 and the increase shall be 50 effective for the following calendar year.

(b) Any person serving as an elected official who has retired from the Teachers' Retirement System may serve for <u>his</u> or <u>her full</u> compensation in an elected public office with the state, a county, or an incorporated municipality without suspension of retirement benefits; provided that under no circumstances shall such a person participate in or accrue



57 additional benefits under the Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement System for that service, and 58 59 provided that under no circumstances shall a person whose 60 retirement is based upon service as an elected official continue in or return to such office and receive both pension 61 62 benefits and salary; provided further, that this subsection 63 shall apply to elected officials whose participation in the 64 Teachers' Retirement System or the Employees' Retirement System is constitutionally required to be upon the same terms 65 and conditions as specified by law for other employees in the 66 retirement system if such elected official's compensation does 67 not exceed the annual earning limits provided in subsection 68 69 <del>(a)</del>.

(c) The responsibility for compliance with this section 70 71 is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree performing duties under this section shall certify to the 72 73 employer any information required in order to carry out this 74 section. The retiree shall provide written notice of the 75 postretirement employment under this section to the Teachers' 76 Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after 77 the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will 78 be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under 79 80 this section."

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"§36-27-8.2

82 (a) Any individual who is retired under the Employees'
83 Retirement System may perform duties in any capacity,
84 including as an independent contractor, with any employer

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85 participating in the Employees' Retirement System or the 86 Teachers' Retirement System without suspension of his or her 87 retirement allowance provided that (1) the individual is not 88 employed in a permanent full-time capacity and (2) the 89 individual's compensation from the employer in calendar year 90 2016 does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). 91 Beginning in calendar year 2017, and each calendar year 92 thereafter, the annual earning limit shall be increased by the 93 same percentage increase as the increase in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers as published by the U.S. 94 95 Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Any increase in the annual earning limit shall be rounded to the next 96 97 lowest multiple of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with any 98 amount in excess of the one thousand dollar (\$1,000) multiple 99 considered in determining the increase for the following year. 100 Each adjustment shall be based on the increase in the index 101 for the preceding 12-month period ending on September 30 and 102 the increase shall be effective for the following calendar 103 year.

104 (b) Any individual serving as an elected official who 105 has retired from the Employees' Retirement System may serve 106 for his or her full compensation in an elected public office 107 with the state, a county, or an incorporated municipality 108 without suspension of retirement benefits; provided that under 109 no circumstances shall such an individual participate in or accrue additional benefits under the Teachers' Retirement 110 System or the Employees' Retirement System for that service, 111 112 and provided that under no circumstances shall



113 an individual whose retirement is based upon service as an 114 elected official continue in or return to the office and 115 receive both pension benefits and salary; provided further, 116 that this subsection shall apply to elected officials whose 117 participation in the Teachers' Retirement System or the 118 Employees' Retirement System is constitutionally required to 119 be upon the same terms and conditions specified by law 120 other employees in the retirement system if the elected official's compensation does not exceed the annual earning 121 limits provided in subsection (a). 122

123 (c) The responsibility for compliance with this section is placed upon the employing authority, and each retiree 124 125 performing duties under this section shall certify to the 126 employer any information required in order to carry out this 127 section. The retiree shall provide written notice of the 128 postretirement employment under this section to the Employees' 129 Retirement System and employing authority within 30 days after 130 the date the retiree knows or should know that he or she will 131 be performing duties on a full-time or permanent basis or will 132 earn an amount in excess of the annual earning limit under 133 this section.

(d) (1) Any individual who is retired under the
Employees' Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace
Officers' Standards and Training certification, and was
classified as either a law enforcement officer, as defined in
Section 36-27-59, or a state policeman, as defined in Section
36-27-1, prior to retirement, may perform duties as either a
school resource officer, as defined in Section 16-1-44.1, or a



141 correctional officer with the Department of Corrections 142 without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, 143 provided that the compensation earned does not exceed 144 fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year. 145 (2) Any individual who is retired under the Employees' 146 Retirement System, has the applicable Alabama Peace Officers' 147 Standards and Training certification, and meets any of the 148 following criteria, may perform duties as a correctional 149 officer with the Department of Corrections without suspension of his or her retirement allowance, provided that the 150 151 compensation earned does not exceed fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) per year: 152 153 a. Was classified as a law enforcement officer, as 154 defined in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement. 155 b. Was classified as a state policeman, as defined in 156 Section 36-27-1, prior to retirement. 157 c. Was classified as a correctional officer, as defined 158 in Section 36-27-59, prior to retirement, and retired pursuant 159 to Section 36-27-16(a)(1)c. 160 (3) No individual may be employed pursuant to this 161 subsection after December 31, 2026."

Section 2. This act shall become effective June 1,2024.
