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4 SJR____ DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES
5 AGENCY TO HIRE AN OUTSIDE CONSULTANT TO STUDY PHARMACY
6 BENEFITS MANAGER PRACTICES.

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8 WHEREAS, pharmacy benefits managers are 9 intermediaries between health insurers and pharmacies which 10 manage the prescription drug benefits component of health 11 insurance plans, negotiate drug pricing, and make 12 reimbursement to dispensing pharmacies in the plan network; 13 and

14 WHEREAS, pharmacy benefits managers engage in 15 multifaceted pricing, fees, and claims adjudication 16 practices that have the effect of inadequately reimbursing 17 pharmacies for the cost of dispensing drugs; and

18 WHEREAS, the Legislature has considered numerous 19 pieces of legislation in the past few years regarding 20 pharmacy benefits manager practices; and

21 WHEREAS, concerns have been raised that inadequate 22 reimbursement practices by pharmacy benefits managers 23 significantly contribute to the alarming rate of pharmacy 24 closures in the State of Alabama; and

25 WHEREAS, the closure of local independent pharmacies 26 disproportionately impacts our rural communities in areas 27 that are already underserved by health care providers, 28 limiting access to essential medications for Alabamians; and

29 WHEREAS, the practices of pharmacy benefits managers 30 and their interaction with the regulation of insurance is 31 complex, and the assistance of outside expertise would be of 32 value; now therefore,

33 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Director of the 34 35 Legislative Services Agency is directed to hire a consultant 36 with national expertise and experience from outside of the 37 state to do a comprehensive study on pharmacy benefits 38 manager practices and their relationship with other actors in the drug supply chain, including drug manufacturers, drug 39 wholesalers, and pharmacy services administration 40 41 organizations, and the resulting effects on prescription 42 drug costs, the practice of pharmacy, and consumer access to 43 medications. Upon approval of this resolution by the 44 Governor, the Director shall request proposals from 45 consultants and choose a qualified expert, who shall 46 undertake the study and report findings and recommendations to the Director, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, 47 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by no later 48 49 than December 1, 2025.
